These workshops address the underrepresentation of women in math and science professions and provide hands-on learning and leadership experiences in science, technology, engineering, math and architecture to at-risk girls from New Haven middle schools and high schools.	\$5,000
<a href="#">City of New Haven Community Services Administration</a>	To support the development of a status report on New Haven's women and girls in the areas of health, safety, education and economic security. The status report will establish a baseline that can be used for current and future programming to improve the lives of women and girls in New Haven.	\$10,000
<a href="#">The Diaper Bank</a>	To support the second phase of the Basic Human Needs Policy Project, a multiyear effort to raise awareness at the Federal level about how the provision of diapers strengthens families and the economic security of the poor.	\$10,000
<a href="#">Higher Heights Youth Empowerment Programs, Inc.</a>	To support a mentoring program that matches female college students, who are also Higher Heights alumni, with girls attending Metropolitan High School who are at risk of not enrolling in or completing a post-secondary education.	\$3,350
